

Back to School 2023: Maximize the Upcoming School Year

Broward County goes back to school on August 21... that's right around the corner! Here are a few helpful tips and important things to remember to kick off a great 2023 school year:

Tax-Free Weekend and Other Back-to-School Sales

Onnaria

Take advantage of this year's tax-exemption holiday, running now through Sunday, August 6. Enjoy tax-free shopping for clothing, electronics, school supplies, and more, both in-store and online.

Many of your favorite stores are also running back-to-school sales during August. Plan ahead and try to snag any deals now before the school year starts. For example, Apple is offering \$100-150 gift cards for the purchase of select Mac or iPad products through Monday, October 2.

Health Check-Ups & Immunizations

Before attending school in Broward County (in-person or virtually) each child must provide a Florida Certification of Immunization (DH 680 form) documenting their immunization status.

To avoid last-minute stress, schedule your child's yearly physical exam in advance and ensure they are up-to-date with any required immunizations for their next grade. Immunization requirements vary based on age, so be sure to check with your child's physician or visit www.floridahealth.gov to verify the requirements.

Set Realistic Goals for the New School Year

It's important to set goals to prepare for a successful school year; goals provide motivation and direction and can boost a

child's self-esteem. Encourage students to set their own goals and provide support where needed. Specific and measurable goals are better than vague ones. For instance, instead of saying "get good grades," a more effective goal could be "maintain an A average in math by dedicating 30 minutes each day to studying." Including details will help with planning, tracking progress, and celebrating small wins along the way.

Optimize At-Home Study Environments

The time your child spends studying at home is just as important as time spent in the classroom. A conducive study environment greatly influences a student's ability to concentrate and learn effectively. Create a dedicated space with minimal distractions, an ergonomic setup, and proper lighting to reduce physical strain and create a supportive environment.

Avoid doing homework in bed or keeping devices nearby. Setting effective study habits at a young age will benefit students in college, the workforce, and beyond.

Register for Extracurricular Activities and Sports

The start of the new school year marks the beginning of many youth sports seasons in Parkland and Coral Springs. Be sure to talk to your students about sports and check registration deadlines ASAP. Visit the respective city websites for details on specific programs.

Springs Soccer Grows Again!

Personal development for each athlete has always been a criterion goal of Springs Soccer Club. SSC has built its entire program on four core pillars: connection, competence, character, and confidence, with a mission to develop youth long-term through a supportive, player-centric environment.

SSC is the only recognized travel soccer program in the city of Coral Springs and the fastest-growing soccer club in South Florida. Sticky Fingers? Trigger Finger may be the Culprit!

Trigger finger is a common medical condition seen in orthopedic offices across the country. Over time, one or multiple fingers may become "sticky," no longer opening and closing smoothly. Trigger finger is most seen in those over the age of 50 and/or are diagnosed with diabetes. Additionally, individuals who are manual laborers and perform repetitive movements with their hands are prone to trigger finger.

In medical terms, trigger finger is caused by stenosing tenosynovitis of the A1 pulley system in the hand. As Dr. Maisel describes it, "The rope that allows you to bend your fingers has a knot in it and is getting caught on another piece of tissue." Symptoms include clicking, catching and pain at the base of the fingers. Unfortunately, trigger finger may slowly progress over time and can become physically locked in a flexed position. Thankfully, at Gelb Sports Medicine & Orthopaedic center we offer many treatment options.

During your visit, you will undergo a thorough evaluation of your hand and fingers. Occasionally, you may be suffering from other conditions such as rheumatoid arthritis, calcific tenosynovitis or carpal tunnel syndrome that will be evaluated during the office visit. An x-ray of the hand will be taken and reviewed with you at the bedside. If you are indeed suffering from trigger finger, a comprehensive plan will be developed. Treatment options include occupational therapy, finger splinting, prescribed anti-inflammatory medication, ultra-sound guided A1 pulley cortisone injection and even percutaneous release of the A1 pulley as well under ultrasound guidance. To elaborate further, percutaneous release of the A1 pulley is an office-based procedure that will free up space for the flexor tendon to glide smoothly and no longer get "caught" on another piece of tissue. Since local anesthesia will be used, you may drive yourself home after the procedure!

As you can see there are many treatment options that can ultimately resolve your trigger finger issues. Call for an appointment today to discuss treatment options for your hard-working hands!

Two separate dates in September will become available to accommodate evaluations. Parents will be notified via e-mail once those dates are finalized.

In addition to an incredible recreational league, Parkland Soccer's travel side of the club boasts impressive growth. Over 500 players have registered this year, and management changes have allowed a newfound focus on strengthening community bonds and developing new avenues for players to reach their potential. Supporting this initiative is enlisting a College Pathway Consultant working to assist high school players as they consider bringing their passion for soccer to college with them.

Get Organized in Time for School

A School Supply Drawer

7 Harmful Ingredients Hiding in your Kid's School Lunches

How do you know if what you are packing for your kids is healthy and nourishes their bodies? Let's take a look at the hidden ingredients.

1. Glyphosate: It's a herbicide spray on corn (tortillas, chips), soy (edamame), oatmeal, wheat (pizza, pasta, bread), and other crops. It destroys your gut microbiome, an endocrine disruptor (affects your thyroid, sex hormones, etc.). It is linked to cancer, neurological disorders, autoimmune disorders, autism, and many more. Please be sure to look for Organic and no GMO options.

2. Added Sugars: To reduce the risk of obesity, heart disease, and increased blood pressure, the American

Heart Association recommends children consume no more than six teaspoons of added sugar per day. The National Cancer Institute found that kids between 4-8 years old eat, on average, 21 teaspoons of sugar and 14-18 years old consume 34.3 teaspoons of sugar! Hint read the labels; sugar is added to juices, yogurt, cereal, granola bars, etc.

3. Artificial Sweeteners: have been linked to allergies, obesity, depression, and an increased risk of cancer. Look for ingredients like sucralose, aspartame,

and saccharin. Where do they hide? Beverages, candy, gum, sugar-free items, etc.

4. Phthalates: an endocrine disruptor linked to cancer and cardiovascular conditions. Where can you find it? Mostly in plastic, water bottles, and during the manufacturing process of foods. How to solve it? Get your child a stainless steel water bottle and prepare most of the food at home. Use a stainless steel lunch box or Thermos.

5. Heavy metals/Toxins: have been linked to autoimmune issues, cancer, obesity, and cardiovascular disease. Where can you find it? In water and packaged, highly processed foods. The best thing you can do is to get a water distiller/filter and send your kids to school with a stainless steel water bottle.

6. Trans fats: have been linked to obesity, cancer, and cardiovascular disease. Where can you find it? In fried foods (think about potato chips and pretzels). Check the trans fats' ingredients list for "partially hydrogenated oils" in processed foods. Also, seed and vegetable oils are horrible for your health; choose better options like ghee, avocado, and coconut oil.

7. Food additives: have been linked to cancer,

asthma, and nervous and digestive disorders. Look for artificial colors, nitrates, nitrites, BPA, MSG, high fructose corn syrup, artificial flavors, etc.

We have seen an epidemic increase in childhood obesity, autoimmune disorders (like celiac disease and type 1 diabetes), autism, asthma, allergies, cancer, and many more.

For example, in 1970, 1:10,000 children developed autism, and in 2020 1:36 children. We are expecting by

2035 to see 1:3 of children will develop autism!

As parents, the best thing we can do is to protect our children by giving them the best food we can afford, avoiding toxins/chemicals, and having them move around (less screen time). We can start by cooking at home and preparing lunches with healthy protein, fruit, and vegetables.


