

The Athlete's Elbow Part 2

Little league elbow is a common problem in the growing athlete and describes medial elbow pain that is attributed to a microscopic injury to the growth plate or apophysis. where the tendon attaches to the inner elbow. Pain and loss of motion are common symptoms of little league elbow. Pitchers sustain the majority of injuries but any player may develop it from overuse. X-rays are very important as part of the work up for little league elbow. Comparison x-rays can be helpful in certain cases to evaluate the extent of the injury. The UCL (ulnar collateral ligament) can be involved in severe cases. If the apophysis or UCL origin is significantly displaced, surgery may be indicated. If the ligament is completely torn, a formal UCL reconstruction (Tommy John procedure) may be needed to return to competitive throwing. Prevention of overuse injury in the throwing athlete is critical to avoid long term injury. Injury to the young athlete's elbow may be prevented by limiting the number of pitches in a game or practice, allowing the athlete adequate rest after throwing, and limiting the number of teams that he or she plays on. Recent studies demonstrate that the fast ball may be worse than breaking pitches for the immature elbow, causing the growth plate to separate or ligament to fail. Fortunately, most athletes can return to their sport after adequate rest and rehabilitation.

Every day, approximately 15 million Americans experience the burning discomfort of heartburn. Although it's a common ailment, it doesn't mean it's harmless.

Heartburn, or acid reflux, can result from overindulging in certain foods or beverages. Frequent heartburn is commonly the result of gastroesophageal reflux disease (GERD).

Lifestyle changes like eating smaller meals, losing weight and not lying flat may help manage the discomfort. Medication may relieve symptoms, but long-term use may not be ideal. In fact, recent research found that taking a common type of acid reflux drug known as proton pump inhibitors for more than 4.4 years is associated with a 33% greater likelihood of developing dementia for people aged 45 and older. long, thin tube with a camera is inserted down the esophagus, enabling doctors to visually examine the upper gastrointestinal tract.

In addition, the Heartburn Center offers EndoFLIP, a potential alternative to manometry, which more comfortably measures the function and tightness of the LES valve. Bravo pH monitoring tests measure pH levels in the esophagus.

"With these three tests, I can provide a complete diagnosis in a much shorter period of time and tailor treatment for the individual patient," Dr. Shachner said.

Advanced Surgical Treatment Options

Advanced surgical treatment options to strengthen the

LES valve include magnetic sphincter augmentation, a procedure in which a small but flexible magnetic ring is implanted around the esophagus.

Transoral incisionless fundoplication, or TIF, is an endoscopic procedure performed through the mouth in which the LES can be reconstructed, and hiatal hernias reduced, while the patient is asleep. Hiatal hernias can also be repaired with robotic surgery.

For Barrett's esophagus, ablation procedures can destroy damaged cells, after which patients are closely monitored to identify and treat any new developments as early as possible.

When to Seek Help

Mark Shachner, M.D., medical director of the Heartburn Center at Broward Health Coral Springs, recommends that heartburn sufferers see a doctor if they're experiencing it multiple times a week, especially if they also have pain or difficulty swallowing, an early sign of esophageal cancer.

"We don't want to mask the symptoms, we want to fix the problem," Dr. Shachner said. "GERD may start with heartburn, but it can potentially lead to more severe issues including damage to the esophagus."

What is GERD?


GERD is caused by a weakening of the lower esophageal sphincter (LES), which acts like a valve between the stomach and esophagus. When this weakens the diaphragm where the esophagus passes through, it can cause a hiatal hernial.

Barrett's esophagus, a condition in which the esophageal lining is damaged by acid reflux, can be a complication of GERD and increases the risk of esophageal cancer.

Identifying the Problem

Fortunately, there are numerous tests to identify what's causing heartburn and the extent of the damage.

Endoscopy is a minimally invasive procedure in which a

Dr. Shachner and the caregivers at the Heartburn Center focus on their patients' long-term outcomes and participate in a multi-institutional study that monitors patients to identify what treatments provide the best results and quality of life for patients. The center is currently enrolling patients to participate in both national and local surgical outcome studies.

As we delve further into the future for women's soccer, Laurie tells me that her intention in Coral Springs is to help every girl see that they could have a prolific future in soccer... Whether she is an outstanding athlete, has a talent for coaching, or wants to be a referee...She is excited to share her experience and knowledge of the game to all players in the SSC. Laurie sees that there are positive opportunities for women in soccer all over the world.



Laurie's focus, whether she is talking about a team from Springs SC or her team from Jamaica has always been player development and the teaching process is ongoing. For her, that is a primary necessity. She says that from entry level to pros, working on a player's mentality (mind-set), tactical understanding, technical skills, social and emotional skills, as well as their physical game are always a priority. SSC prides itself in parent education. For the best development of the player, Coach Laurie says it's important to educate the parents in order to keep goals realistic while supporting the player.

In the meanwhile, Laurie is currently working with the Reggae Girlz in preparation for the upcoming Olympic Qualifiers, held in Kingston, Jamaica and Toronto, Canada in late September .
