With the population of Florida, including Coral Springs and Parkland, expanding exponentially over the last three years, it's no surprise that a special little gem in the western part of Coral Springs has become a vital place for teaching and expanding young minds from Kindergarten through 8th grade. At or near capacity for certain grades, school Principal Gus Prats tells me that there is a waitlist for certain grade levels. Please reach out for a tour of this impressive school as soon as possible!

The mission of Summit Academy Charter School is to offer a rigorous and high-quality education that focuses on "CLASS," which stands for Character, Leadership, Academics, Service, and Sportsmanship. The school's philosophy is that without these components, students are unable to achieve their maximum learning potential. Their unique vision is believing an education is more than the teaching of the core subjects. A school, well-connected with the home and the community, is a place for students to grow academically, socially, emotionally and physically.

Beginning in 2019 with 170 students, the school has now expanded to 475 students and includes many happy families that have watched their children learn and thrive in this safe, secure environment. Safety has always been a top priority since day one, and the school has its own full-time Guardian, who is certified to oversee school safety by the Broward Sheriff's Office. Mr. Prats makes it a point to tell me that they have had no trouble with any type of school violence during their five years. That is quite a testimony! Mr. Prats says, "It's a smaller school atmosphere... our biggest disciplinary issues are occasional uniform violations. We will never be that 1,000 student place, and we don't want to be. We like that it's more of a family environment." He continues by relating to the families who bring their children to school for the first time. "These kindergarten parents are letting go of their child and it's daunting. They go to these kindergarten round-ups and find out that there are 11 different kindergarten classrooms, and they feel overwhelmed. When they come here, they see that our kindergarten is in four different sections all on the same floor sharing the same bathrooms. It's a lot less intimidating."

Making the school feel more like a family atmosphere is paramount to everyone on staff. The policy is that every person is referred to by their first name, parents are encouraged to be involved, no excessive homework is given, and every teacher on the education team is certified by the state of Florida.

Principal Gus Prats, has been a driving force from day one. His decades of experience in education combined with his compassion and acceptance of others, has made him a respected leader at both Summit Academy Charter School, and throughout the charter school system. Recently, the Florida Consortium of Public Charter Schools awarded Mr. Prats with The Champion Charter School Leader for 2023.

Because of their tremendous success, and Mr. Prats' effective leadership, Summit Academy Charter School has just been approved to open a second location in the Orlando area. This proves to many that the charter system is highly effective and pleasing to so many families!



Rotator Cuff Injuries

The rotator cuff (four muscles that hold the ball of the shoulder in the socket) acts as a dynamic stabilizer of the shoulder joint during various overhead motions and can be injured by trauma or repetitive overuse. Rotator cuff tears and disorders were once thought only to affect older patients. However, with the rising popularity of overhand sports, repetitive work tasks and weight training, rotator cuff injuries are seen in younger patients. The initial treatment for these injuries may involve relative rest and rehabilitation. Rotator cuff disorders may be classified into bursitis, tendonopathy without tear, partial tears, and full thickness tears. MRI has become the diagnostic, noninvasive imaging modality of choice for evaluating cuff disorders. Arthroscopy is still the gold standard for evaluating the integrity of the rotator cuff. Treatment for partial thickness cuff tears may involve debridement (removal of the non healthy, torn fibers) or direct repair of the tendon. Full thickness rotator cuff tears are often treated by repairing the torn tendon back to the bone. Using new techniques, even large, retracted rotator cuff tears can be repaired arthroscopically without opening the shoulder. This innovative approach to the rotator cuff is analogous to the development of other less invasive procedures such as laparoscopic surgery. The arthroscopic cuff repair is routinely performed on an outpatient basis using a combination of general and regional anesthesia. For massive, irreparable tears, a reverse shoulder replacement can provide patients significant functional improvement. Post-operative treatment involves minimal immobilization combined with a structured rehab program.

Local Legacies of Excellence: CSYS and Parkland Soccer Club

Despite the lack of proper facilities, Hugh and his team of dedicated volunteers worked tirelessly to train coaches, players, and referees. They utilized fields at Mullins Park, Lions Park, and even their own backyards to make their vision a reality. When goal nets were ripped, the women would crochet the weak areas. This team effort built an unbreakable foundation for CSYS for years to come.

Hugh's legacy lives on. Today, the program boasts more than 2000 players and includes multiple generations of players and coaches. The community-based program focuses on skill development and teamwork, creating a supportive environment to learn and love the game of soccer. The city of Coral Springs is preparing to honor Hugh with a commemorative plaque at Mullins Field as the league's 50th anniversary approaches.

Parkland Soccer Club

Similarly, Parkland Soccer Club has come a long way

since its inception 36 years ago. Originally practicing and playing on a cow pasture, the organization has thrived thanks to a strong footing, the community's support, and of course, the growing interest in soccer.

It all started in 1987 with co-founders Pete and Linda Gato, who dedicated their lives to the league. The late couple played a crucial role in transforming Parkland Soccer from a simple pasture into the well-equipped fields at Pine Trails Park.

Today, Parkland Soccer provides a recreational league for boys and girls, offering them an opportunity to develop their skills and form new friendships. Recently, Parkland Soccer has expanded its offerings for young girls by creating U6 and U7 girls divisions, which were historically coed.

Beyond teaching the game, Parkland Soccer focuses on building personal qualities such as self-esteem, physical fitness, respect, and achievement. The program also offers a unique and supportive opportunity for high school students interested in becoming referees.

Getting Involved

The impactful contributions of these organizations are a testament to their rich history and commitment to our community. For new and experienced players alike, both Coral Springs Youth Soccer and Parkland Soccer Club offer valuable opportunities for development on and off the field.
