

There is no doubt, sometime in the future, South Florida will be visited by another hurricane. Count on it. As Hurricane Season began on June 1 and ends November 30, now is the time to get ready. Before you panic at impending event, make plans now, and start procuring supplies. Thankfully, TP is back in stock! Nothing eases stress during an emergency like having many of the details and decisions resolved in advance. Here are some tips for getting prepared from the Florida Department of Health:

Make an emergency plan: It should include, a) All members of your household, b) Special medical conditions, c) When and to where you would evacuate, d) Special transportation needs, e) Emergency meeting place, f) An out-of-town contact who everyone can call to stay in touch, and g) Pet plan.

Gather emergency supplies: a) A gallon of water per person for 7 days, b) Non-perishable foods such as canned meat, fish, veggies, fruits and nuts, c) Can opener, disposable plates and utensils, and d) Matches and cooking gel.

Stock up on medical needs: a) 30 day supply of prescription medications from your doctor, b) Over the counter pain reliever, antacids, anti-diarrheal medicine and children's medicine, c) List of all medications and essential medical devices, e) Physician contact number, and f) Blood type and allergies for all household members.

Assemble a first-aid kit with sterile bandages, cleansing agent, safety pins, gauze pads, scissors, sewing needle, moist towelettes and tape.

Collect essential data in a waterproof container. A) Contact information for property insurer, official emergency agencies, family and friends, b) Credit card and bank information, c) Portable computer storage device with electronic copies of mortgage, home deed, car title, etc. c) Instructions for shutting off utilities, and d) Pet health records.

List your major home belongings and back it up with photos.



Celebrating 54 Years of Baseball



Coral Springs American Little League Prepares for Fall Season

Coral Springs American Little League (CSALL) has been a part of the city's history since 1971. As the oldest officially recognized baseball league in Coral Springs, it continues to offer youth players structured, skill-building opportunities in a community-oriented setting. Each season brings new players, returning families, and a full calendar of practices and games held at Mullins Park.

Registration for the 2025 Fall Ball season opens July 1. The league will again welcome players ages 4 to 16, with a notable change that went into effect this past season: under a new Little League rule, players ages 4, 5, and 6 can now register with any local league, regardless of residential boundaries. CSALL is continuing to adopt this policy for the fall season, allowing families from neighboring cities to participate in its youngest divisions.

"We saw about a 10 percent increase in the four, five, and six-year-old group this spring," said League President Tony Juliano. "It's a good way to get more of those younger kids into the league."

This past spring season saw close to 300 enrollments. With regular-season play complete, CSALL is now in the All-Star phase, with teams competing in district tournaments across several age groups.

Notably, CSALL's 8U team had competed in the District 10 Select Tournament–an achievement that reflects the league's strong foundation in player development and teamwork.

In addition to the core divisions, CSALL has continued running its middle school division through

the Intermediate League. The program has been operating in collaboration with Little League International as part of a potential charter pilot and remains popular with older players seeking more advanced competition. It serves as a natural next step for players who have aged out of the younger divisions but want to continue playing within a structured and challenging environment.

While baseball remains the focus, CSALL also emphasizes character, community, and growth off the field.

> Parents and community members regularly volunteer their time as coaches, umpires, and team coordinators, ensuring each season runs smoothly. High school students can also volunteer and earn service hours by helping out with various league activities.

Reflecting on the spring season, Juliano shared, "This was one of our strongest seasons in recent memory. The league ran smoothly, and the feedback from families has been very positive. We had a lot of new parents get involved, and it's always great to see the community come together to support the kids."

With the fall 2025 season approaching, families are encouraged to mark their calendars for the upcoming registration. Players aged 4 to 6 are not subject to boundary restrictions, while players age 7 and older must live within the CSALL boundary or meet eligibility through Coral Springs public schools or a City of Coral Springs Sports Card.

But, like any great story, Longo's journey took an unexpected turn. "Recently, I was forced to start over," he shares. "It's a long story, but I still own nearly half of Blue Realty and have launched a luxury brand I'm extremely proud of: Icon Realty."

With a new black-and-gold color scheme and 15 wrapped vehicles already hitting the streets, Icon Realty is more than a comeback—it's a reinvention. Over 40 agents from Blue Realty have joined Longo in this new venture, and the team is currently undertaking a \$250,000 office buildout at their new flagship location in "The Walk" at 2808 University Drive in Coral Springs. A second



office is also open in Fort Lauderdale managed by seasoned real estate expert, Madison Gianchetta.

"Our goal isn't just to sell luxury homes—it's to set a new standard for what luxury real estate should feel like," Longo says.

Now, Michael Longo is bringing his vision and energy to television. He's set to star in a brandnew TV show titled Boss of Real Estate, which will be airing soon on two major networks. The show will spotlight Longo's journey, his bold approach to business, and the high-stakes world of luxury real estate. "It's going to be a behind-the-scenes look at what it really takes to build an empire and the hustle that comes with it," he says.

While his business accomplishments are impressive, it's clear that Michael Longo is equally proud of the life he's built outside the office. Having just celebrated his 40th birthday, Longo is a devoted husband and father. He recently married the love of his life, Ashley, and the couple lives in Parkland with their four beautiful children.

"I'm a very involved father," he says with a

smile. "My faith is a big part of my life. We go to Church by the Glades, and I try to lead my family with the same integrity and work ethic I bring into my business."

From humble beginnings to building two of the most talked-about real estate brands in Florida—and now stepping into the national spotlight—Michael Longo's story is one of vision, resilience, and unstoppable momentum. And if the past is any indication, the best is yet to come.





Hello Coral Springs and Parkland! My name is Ravin Sajnani, and I'm an Ophthalmologist practicing in Coral Springs. In this monthly piece, I'd like to share some interesting and useful tidbits about our eyes - how they work and how we can take care of them.

This month we'll focus on diabetes and the eyes. As many of us know, Diabetes Mellitus (typically just referred to as diabetes) is a medical condition in which blood sugar can run high. Over time, high blood sugar can damage the small blood vessels of the body. Three common complications that can happen when the small blood vessels get damaged are diabetic nephropathy (affecting the kidneys), diabetic neuropathy (affecting nerves), and diabetic retinopathy (affecting the retina - the back of the eye where our eyes' nerves are). Diabetic retinopathy typically starts silently, and often one can experience no symptoms until the condition has advanced significantly. At its worst, diabetic retinopathy can cause macular edema (fluid in the retina), death of regions of the retina, and retinal detachments.

The best way to prevent diabetic retinopathy is to make sure your blood sugar is well controlled. This can be accomplished by working closely with your primary care provider who can advise you on healthy diet and exercise habits. Beyond this, since diabetic retinopathy often starts without symptoms, it is important for everyone diagnosed with diabetes to have a dilated eye exam at least once a year. This way, the retinopathy can be caught and, if necessary, treated earlier.

He took me to see Saving Private Ryan—a bold choice for a young kid—and his lessons of courage and service endure, though he passed when I was 12. The Indian Princesses echoes this truth: collaboration builds something greater than the sum of its parts. Whether we're camping, grilling, or sharing stories, we forge bonds that strengthen Parkland and make giving to something bigger than ourselves deeply meaningful.

I dream of a thriving, eco-friendly Parkland where families connect and flourish. Let's replace astroturf with native plants to nurture our environment. I invite you to join the Indian Princesses—men, let's grow as fathers; women, encourage the fathers in your lives to connect. My wife, daughters, and I—expecting our fifth child—are grateful for this community that lifts us all. Together, we can make Parkland a beacon of health, connection, and sustainability.

This Father's Day, we honor those who paved the way—my dad, Clarence, Spike. Their wisdom inspires us to lead with heart, build community, and shape a future where every family thrives. Family Orthopaedic Care

Sticky Fingers? Trigger Finger may be the Culprit!

Trigger finger is a common medical condition seen in orthopedic offices across the country. Over time, one or multiple fingers may become "sticky," no longer opening and closing smoothly. Trigger finger is most seen in those over the age of 50 and/or are diagnosed with diabetes. Additionally, individuals who are manual laborers and perform repetitive movements with their hands are prone to trigger finger.

In medical terms, trigger finger is caused by stenosing tenosynovitis of the A1 pulley system in the hand. As Dr. Maisel describes it, "The rope that allows you to bend your fingers has a knot in it and is getting caught on another piece of tissue." Symptoms include clicking, catching and pain at the base of the fingers. Unfortunately, trigger finger may slowly progress over time and can become physically locked in a flexed position. Thankfully, at Gelb Sports Medicine & Orthopaedic center we offer many treatment options.

During your visit, you will undergo a thorough evaluation of your hand and fingers. Occasionally, you may be suffering from other conditions such as rheumatoid arthritis, calcific tenosynovitis or carpal tunnel syndrome that will be evaluated during the office visit. An x-ray of the hand will be taken and reviewed with you at the bedside. If you are indeed suffering from trigger finger, a comprehensive plan will be developed. Treatment options include occupational therapy, finger splinting, prescribed anti-inflammatory medication, ultra-sound guided A1 pulley cortisone injection and even percutaneous release of the A1 pulley as well under ultrasound guidance. To elaborate further, percutaneous release of the A1 pulley is an officebased procedure that will free up space for the flexor tendon to glide smoothly and no longer get "caught" on another piece of tissue. Since local anesthesia will be used, you may drive yourself home after the procedure!

As you can see there are many treatment options that can ultimately resolve your trigger finger issues. Call for an appointment today to discuss treatment options for your hard-working hands!

Pediatrician-Approved Ways to Keep Kids Safe This Summer

As the days grow longer and the temperatures rise, summer becomes a season full of adventure for childrenwhether it's running through sprinklers, biking around the neighborhood, or enjoying a day at the pool. While these activities bring joy and lasting memories, they also come with risks. Here are some important tips to keep in mind.

1.Hydration

Staying hydrated is essential for kids, especially during our Florida hot summer months when children are more active and lose fluids quickly through sweat. Make sure your child drinks plenty of water throughout the dayeven before they feel thirsty. Pack a refillable water bottle whenever you're on the go or a frozen water bottle for a

cool drink during activities. Signs of dehydration can include dry mouth, fatigue, dizziness, and fewer wet diapers or bathroom trips, so keep an eve out and remind kids to take regular water breaks.

2. Burn Prevention

Summer fun can sometimes come with hidden burn risks. Fireworks, even small sparklers, can cause serious injuries and should always be handled by adults. Hot sidewalks, sand, and pool surfaces can burn bare feet quickly-so encourage kids to wear shoes or sandals when walking outside. Remind them to test surfaces with their hand before sitting or playing, and always keep an eye on

younger children around grills, fire pits, and other hot objects. A little caution goes a long way in preventing painful burns.

3. Water Safety

Water naturally draws kids in, making it crucial to stay extra alert whenever they're near it-even in shallow areas. To keep your child safe, consider these key tips: start swim lessons early and monitor their progress and ensure no one swims alone. Young children should remain an arms length distant from a reliable adult while learning to swim. Don't forget to stay aware of weather changes and steer clear of rip currents while visiting the beach.

4. Sun Protection

While the summer sun can feel great, it can also cause harmful sunburns-especially in children, who are more vulnerable to UV damage. Protect their skin with UPF 50 clothing, hats, and sunglasses, and apply broad-spectrum, water-resistant sunscreen with at least SPF 30 to exposed areas. Reapply every two hours, and after

swimming or sweating.

5. Head injury/ Trauma Prevention

Wearing a helmet during activities such as riding a bicycle, skateboard or electric scooter can prevent head and brain injuries in children. Golf cart-related injuries occur at double the rate in children as they do in adults, according to the American Academy of Pediatrics. To prevent injuries, children should wear seat belts in golf carts, helmets on bicycles, skateboards, electric scooters and all terrain vehicles and the driver must be legally licensed and not under the influence of drugs or alcohol.

With a few simple precautions, you can help your child enjoy all summer has to offer while staying healthy and protected. As a pediatrician, I encourage families to stay informed, stay prepared, and most of all, stay present. Here's to a safe, active, and joy-filled summer




